### **Treasurer Report**

\$150,000 transferred in CD's/treasury notes. \$30K in money market, \$40K into a 1,2-, and 3-year CD  
\$50K going in LCEF, may add more.

Endowment handling the 18K electrical

Got the food pantry tax exempt form

We are in the black and all bills are paid.

### **Elders Report**

Rodger & Betty Foster were transferred to Zion Lutheran Church in October.

Randy & Elaine Skipworth requested (and the Elders concurred) a transfer to Calvary Lutheran Church.

The Emmaus Thanksgiving dinner (Saturday after Thanksgiving) was mentioned. The urgent need for refrigerator space was brought up. It was decided to remove the large non-working unit, replace it with ones from the nursery room (and possibly purchase an additional unit).

### **Property Board**

The Properties Board is pleased to share several important updates regarding recent maintenance and improvement projects around our church facilities:

The electrical upgrade work in the kitchen basement has been completed, improving safety and reliability.

The leaky steam valve for the boilers has been replaced and boilers startup completed, ensuring continued efficient heating as we move into the colder months.

A new water heater has been installed in the basement of the kitchen, providing hot water for our daily needs. Weather stripping has been applied to all exterior doors to help prevent drafts and reduce energy costs this winter.

New light bulbs will soon be installed in the gym to replace those that burned out.

Discuss and direction for use of dumpster or can containers.

We appreciate everyone's patience and support as these improvements were made. These updates help keep our facilities safe, comfortable, and ready to serve our congregation and community.

Considerations to discuss will be calling a pastoral candidate and possibly follow up with the District to add Emmaus to the Seminarian candidate list.

## Outreach Board

The Outreach Board met on Tuesday, November 4 with members, Karla Frownfelter, JoAnn Riemer, Robert Carey, Katie Arritt, Sandy Duncan, and Sherry Jett in attendance. Tresa Strakis and Kenny Colton were not there.

We began by reading Psalm 29 as our devotion and having a prayer.

Robert gave us the **PANTRY REPORT**. We were told that there were 31 families who showed up today, but they have a limit of 28. The numbers of clients are up, but the donations are also up. He specifically mentioned Immanuel Christian at Morris & East St. as being a donator. The "Reverse Advent Calendar" has been published in our latest church newsletter to encourage church members to donate. Sherry Jett mentioned she's been helping at the Pantry for 20 years. **Pleasant surprise—On the Channel 8 News at 10 P.M. on Wednesday, Nov. 5, the Emmaus Pantry was featured. They interviewed Julie Raasch.** (This all had to do with the food shortages and the Gov't shutdown.) This was good exposure for our Pantry! **FREE "THANKSGIVING" DINNER.** This will take place on Saturday, November 29, from 12 Noon till 2 p.m. We will be using the same format as last year, asking for donations of all items from the congregation members. Jeff Frownfelter has graciously taken charge of this event for the congregation. The menu is the usual Thanksgiving menu with roast turkey, gravy, mashed potatoes, sweet potatoes, green beans, and rolls. Assorted flavors of pies are available for dessert. We offer coffee, lemonade, and water to drink. This meal is dine-in or carry-out.

We are sending out flyers to the Pantry clients to advertise, of course. Also, Sherry Jett volunteered to get some flyers out to be posted in the neighborhood into businesses, etc. that will allow us to put them up. The banners that were put on the fence by our park need to have some modifications made to them to hang them up this year. The Riemers are seeing to this and getting those put up soon.

We next discussed doing an **ADVENT DINNER**. We will be doing the dinner on December 17. We plan to serve 3 kinds of soup, with salad, crackers, rolls, fruit, dessert, and beverages.

We spent a little time signing up for the upcoming **SUNDAY TREATS**. Then Robert closed our meeting out with prayer.

Next board meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, December 2, at 6:30.

## LENTEN SEASON

Ash Wednesday, which in 2026 falls on **February 18**, marks the beginning of the holy season of Lent in the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. While many Christians recognize Ash Wednesday for its distinctive sign of the cross in ashes on the forehead, the LCMS understands this day not as a mere ritual or cultural tradition but as a deeply theological moment—one grounded in Scripture, centered on repentance, and focused on Christ's saving work.

Lent begins with God's call to repentance. The point is not self-improvement or spiritual performance. Repentance, in Lutheran theology, always leads us back to Christ's mercy. As Luther wrote, the entire life of a Christian is to be one of repentance—daily drowning of the old Adam and rising in new life through the Gospel.

Service will start at 7:00pm with the Imposition of Ashes. Like in the past, we will have a fellowship meal prior to service starting at 5:30pm

## PANTRY NEWS

In 12 November days, the Emmaus Food Pantry served 1,287 individuals from 339 families. We anticipate similar numbers December through February as the need in our community grows. Thank you for helping us encourage our neighbors with your donations as our dedicated volunteers share the good news of our loving Savior to them—food for the soul.

We appreciate our sister congregations and Lutheran High School for sharing their many blessings with us throughout the year and for their extra efforts at Thanksgiving and Christmas that filled our shelves. Immanuel UCC on Prospect and East Sts always collects trunkful of food and hygiene products for the community along with a healthy check. Gleaners allotted us \$1,100 from donations that they raised this year, and our regular DAP partners and donors continue to amaze us with their generosity.

Families of long time faithful volunteers, Mary Jane Mack and Doug and Ann George, left memorials to the pantry and their children gave an added Christmas donation this year. Even the Ft Square business community called to lend a hand

We are keeping many of our Emmaus volunteers busy unloading and storing the monthly Gleaners heavy orders, the weekly donations from Aldis, Dollar General, Bimbos and Second Helpings, and directly serving those who come to our pantry Monday through Wednesday afternoons. Robert Carey leads those volunteers daily and Julie Raasch makes sure the food is boxed and ready to hand out, the clothes clean and neatly displayed and the hygiene kits assembled for distribution.

We appreciate the years of volunteer hours that Kenny Colton and Rosetta Cantwell gave to the pantry and wish them well in their "pantry retirement". As the Emmaus Food Pantry starts the 40th year serving our neighbors, we count our blessings for all of you. God provides.

### Book of the Bible


Starting January 4<sup>th</sup> we will begin to explore this during the Sunday School hour. Come join us in the conference room from 8:45-9:45am.




