## **Semi-Annual Voters Meeting**

January 18, 2026

35 members present

Pastor Irmer opened with prayer.

## **Endowment Report**

Gerald Roesener presented the Endowment Report and will email the official report to Carol for distribution.

## **Treasurer Report**

1. All bills are currently paid, and the church is in the black.
2. We received \$177,183.13 in Paycheck Protection Plan funds from the US Government for late 2020/early2021.
3. We paid off the \$50,550 school loan and the balance of the Church's mortgage. \$6690.00
4. We deposited \$150,000 with Stifel, to be managed by Endowment.
  - a: \$30,00 put into a Money Market account.
  - b: \$40,000 each put into 1 year, 2 years, and 3 years CDs.
5. We have \$101,000 deposited with the Lutheran Church Extension Fund in an All-Access Account. This money is liquid but still draws some interest.
6. Currently checking account balance is \$11,000.
7. The only current major expense outstanding is approximately \$5500 for a valve repair in the old boiler room. We have yet to receive a bill although the work was completed several months ago.

## **Elders Report**

Since the June 1, 2025, semi-annual meeting to present, the Elders have continued to review the needs of the congregation and bring Communion to shut-ins.

The Elders completed reading the book: About Our Liturgy (Meaning, History & Practice of the Lutheran Church) by David Kind.

Mary Jane's funeral brought to attention the need for additional signage for restrooms, parking, etc. (This has been accomplished by the Property Board.)

Our pantry was on the news, and it generated donations through Gleaners. We had a \$1000 credit, and we used most of that during November and December. We will finish using it in our January order.

  - Pray for God's will to be done, pray for guidance of next steps if Call accepted Elders to discuss date of Installation Service. If Call returned, Call committee recommends consideration and a vote to request a seminarian.

\*Call was returned. The voters agreed that we will vote 2 weeks from January 18th to decide if we want a seminarian or to work off another list.

## Properties Report

Thanks to everyone for their time and effort to maintain our facilities.

### Recent Activities

- Upgraded Pantry electrical to meet code.
- Upgraded 400 amp disconnect in kitchen basement for safety and code.
- Replaced water heater in kitchen basement.
- Replaced leaky Boiler Valve in Sanctuary basement.
- Replaced Boiler pressure control unit in Sanctuary basement.
- Replaced Women's gym restroom faucet and supply lines.
- Replaced Women's handicap toilet flush valve.
- Replaced roof A/C capacitor above Carol and Pastor's offices.
- Installed door sweeps and insulation to prevent cold air drafts.
- Replaced recycle water-pump in kitchen ice maker.
- Contracted "Classic Landscaping – Francisco" for snow removal.
- Removed the broken cooler previously used for the school.
- Estimate for Walk-in freezer deemed to be not cost effective for repair cost of \$10K (due to worn bindings in motor and age of the unit – contractor estimated total replacement cost of \$15K)
- Pickle Ball players replaced all lights in the gym ceiling (thanks guys!)

### To Do Major activities

- Endowment considerations:
  - Coordinate estimates for leaky roof repairs/replacement 80s building.
  - Consideration of replacing Sanctuary carpet
- Coordinate and accept estimates for Pantry foundation repairs.
- Sanctuary Boiler repairs
  - Backflow and pressure valve replacement
  - Power supply cutover for circulating motor primary/backup.
  - Replace Sight tube for water level.
- Address grant opportunities based on grant writer David Keiser
- Review and estimate opportunities based on 125-year capital campaign results

### To Do minor activities

- Remove 1<sup>st</sup> floor window air conditioners and secure openings to building
- Work with Pastor to order a new desk for his office (delivery and setup)
- Jake to refinish gym floor spring of 2026 (after snow and salt)
- Continue to monitor broken/shifted sewer drain – located near gym entrance
- Consider replacing 2<sup>nd</sup> floor restroom sensor faucets with manual faucets and new supply lines
- Repair Vent fan over kitchen oven/stove

## Outreach Board

The Outreach Board members are Sandy Duncan, Karla Frownfelter, Tresa Strakis, JoAnn Riemer, Katie Arritt, Robert Carey, Kenny Colton, and Sherry Jett.

The **PANTRY** is a part of our board, so at each meeting Robert gives us an update on how things are going at the Pantry.

During the summer last year we planned to have a cookout in the park outdoors. We had it scheduled for a Friday night at the end of July. It turned out there was a heat advisory out due to the sweltering temperatures, so our **JULY 25 COOKOUT** was in held inside the gym at Emmaus from 5:30 to 7:30. Two of

our male volunteers grilled the meats right outside the kitchen so that we still had grilled hamburgers and hot dogs. We also had assorted chips, baked beans, potato salad, watermelon, and assorted cookies. There was also ice cream available with various toppings to make sundaes, and the drinks were water, lemonade, and iced tea. The \$250 Thrivent money was almost totally used up + a few other items were donated by board members for our delicious meal. Attendance included 29 from the congregation and at least that many from the Pantry and the neighborhood—we are estimating a total of 60+. The senior's Bible class had put together about 60 "outreach bags" that contained a flyer about our church's ministry, service times, etc. and a small amount of candy (non-chocolate type). All of these were passed out to non-church members who came to the event. Entertainment was two corn hole games, basketballs at the hoops in the gym, and appropriate music provided electronically by one of our church members. When "The Twist" came on, a couple of our people even got motivated to dance! As people were leaving, one of our guest families discovered they had a flat tire! So a few of our Emmaus' "mechanics" stepped up and came to the rescue to change the tire so they could drive home. Praise be to God for a successful event!

**OCTOBERFEST** took place on Friday, September 26, from 5:30-7:30 p.m. The weather for this year's event was perfect so we could be outside! Hallelujah! This year's event was expertly handled by Karla Frownfelter. She and her helpers had the obstacle/complication to deal with of having a very large wedding rehearsal taking place at the same time and the gym being set up using all our tables and chairs. In addition to our equipment, the wedding reception had brought in tables/chairs from St. John's and Calvary to use. These got mixed up with ours due to labeling issues. We ended up borrowing tables and chairs for our event, mostly from the Strakis family. All Glory be to God that they had some to lend! . Karla had received \$250 Thrivent funding to pay for this event. Katie Arritt was her shopping assistant for this event. **NO CHURCH FUNDS WERE SPENT ON THIS EVENT!** One thing Karla experienced was that she planned to spend Thrivent money on the German meat, but when she presented the charge card in payment it had expired! That was an expensive blunder. The food consisted of German sausages and hot dogs expertly grilled by our volunteers, served on buns with your choice of various condiments, pretzels, chips, homemade German potato salad, green beans, sauerkraut, applesauce (individual cups), and an assortment of yummy desserts prepared by our volunteer chefs. The drinks were an assortment of root beer and various other soda pops and bottled water. Guests were also given small Outreach Bags and a half sheet flyer about upcoming events at Emmaus. These had been prepared on Wednesday, September 24 by the senior's Bible study class. They consisted of 2 chocolates, a mint, a Christian bracelet, a Bible verse card, and information about Emmaus Lutheran Church. They were quite popular. Thanks to Sandy Duncan for donating the plastic bags and the candy! Any leftover homemade food was sent home with interested people in carry-out boxes. The estimated number who came to our event was about 60 or so, + the 16 or so volunteers who helped, making for a total of around **80**. In addition to our Emmaus parishioners, those who came included quite a few from the Pantry and a number of families of our former school students. We had nice recorded music provided by Charlie Schwomeyer. For entertainment, we provided 2 corn hole games, 2 basketballs, and of course the playground was very popular on the lovely fall evening. Our publicity was done in the usual way by the banners on the fence, posting flyers in the church windows & doors and passing out a lot of flyers at the Pantry. We also publicized our event at Central Christian Academy, where a lot of our former students now attend school. We have a connection there because our church member Kathy Rogers is employed there.

We held a **FREE COMMUNITY "THANKSGIVING DINNER"** on Saturday, November 29, from 12 Noon till 2 p.m. Jeff Frownfelter took charge of this event for the congregation. We used the same format as last year, asking for donations of all items from the congregation members. We were amazed at how quickly the volunteer sign-up sheets to donate food filled up! The Lord inspired our people to give! The menu was the usual Thanksgiving menu with roast turkey, gravy, mashed potatoes, sweet potatoes, green beans, and rolls. Assorted flavors of pies were available for dessert. We offered coffee, lemonade, and water to drink. The meal was dine-in or carry-out. We fed about 50 people, and had 10 volunteers on the day of the event. We sent flyers to the Pantry clients to advertise, of course. Sherry Jett hoped to get some flyers out to be posted in the neighborhood into businesses, etc. that would allow us to put them up. We posted banners on the fence by our park. The Riemer's provided some different banners with the Saturday information on it.

The **CHRISTMAS BREAKFAST 2025** took place on Saturday December 6 and was co-sponsored by the Fellowship Board and the Outreach Board. The estimated attendance for this year's event was 110. We were pleased to see people attend who were clients from the Pantry. There were also former school families in attendance as well as people from the neighborhood.

The gym was converted into a "Christmas Wonderland" on Friday, December 5 by Carol Chandler and Sue McFarland. They used lots of holiday decorations including a Santa tree, a nativity banner, and colorful

table decorations. People were greeted at the door by two members of the Outreach Board who passed out slips of paper that informed people of the variety of activities available. Instead of a formal guest registration, the children were encouraged to write letters to Santa and these were placed in an addressed envelope in "Santa's Mailbox". These are receiving a reply from Emmaus this month. This letter will talk about the Christmas Breakfast and invite them to the Easter Egg Hunt. We had an amazingly efficient kitchen crew who produced a menu of pancakes, sausage, scrambled eggs, cinnamon rolls, orange juice, water, and milk. The activities were several different crafts, cookie decorating, and face painting. Hot cocoa was also available, made up in individual cups with mini-marshmallows on top. Santa was an acquaintance of one of our church members and donated his services. He brought along his own elf to join in the festivities. We also had 28 other people in attendance who helped in various ways, 6 of whom were Thrivent members. All children who visited Santa were given a candy cane. This event was paid for by \$250 in Thrivent money and the church incurred no debt. JoAnn Riemer applied for the Thrivent funds, and Carol Chandler did all the shopping. The Thrivent money was spent on the food, decorations, and cookies for decorating—a total of \$179.44. There is about \$70 left over, which will be spent on a folding table.

The Outreach Board did the **ADVENT DINNER** on Wednesday, December 17. We served 3 kinds of homemade soup, with salad, crackers, rolls, fruit, dessert, and beverages.

As usual, our board continues to host the **SUNDAY TREATS** and we're having great success with this activity. A number of congregation members also volunteer to help out with this popular Sunday event. Anyone who wants to bring treats, just let JoAnn Riemer know.

Upcoming events will probably include an Everybody's Birthday Party (No Date Set Yet), and our board always does the Easter Egg Hunt (March 28/day before Palm Sunday). We'll work on the details at our next board meeting which is February 3.

### **Board of Fellowship**

The board continued monthly meals, and will continue to do so.

We had 3 Advent meals. Fellowship, Outreach, and Ellwyn provided them.

We had a successful Christmas Breakfast.

Will start Lent meal on February 18th.

We served 284 households over 11 days in January which represents 1,144 individuals in need you supported.

Karla Frownfelter, Tresa Strakis, Katie Arritt, Kenny Colton, and Sherry Jett were not present for various reasons.

Robert gave us the **PANTRY** report for this month. We were told about the ongoing difficulties which the clients who come are facing, and asked to pray for the staff who help them. Also, Robert told us that they had gotten a nice donation of meat from a local retailer whose freezer gave out on them. These meats need to be weighed. They could use a lot of canned goods though.

Our next topic was the **SUNDAY TREATS**. Karla signed up for Sunday, February 8 via her text. We didn't have our usual sign-up sheet available, so we will continue this activity on Sunday mornings

Then we had a short discussion about the possibility of the Outreach Board handling **FUNERAL TREATS**.

This had come up as a result of Elwyn's request/suggestion to JoAnn on the Sunday following Helen O'Connor's funeral. He and Pat Klinge had done coffee and donuts for the family during the visitation before Helen's service, and he wondered if this would be a good thing for our board to do for funerals in the future. Because there were only 3 board members present, we decided to discuss this in the future when we had a more complete board in attendance.

We discussed the possibility of hosting an **EVERYBODY'S BIRTHDAY PARTY** again this year. Last year's event was a congregation event and took place on a cold, snowy Sunday in February after a fellowship dinner. We decided that we didn't want to host this event during the winter this year, maybe saving it for another time of year and finding a way to include the community.

Since it is getting close to the beginning of Lent, we did decide that our board would host a **LENTEN DINNER**. With six dates to choose from, and after talking to Carol the next day, the Outreach Board will be doing the dinner on Wednesday, March 4. We haven't chosen our menu yet.

Our big event of the spring will be the **EASTER EGG HUNT** which is scheduled for Saturday, March 28, the day before Palm Sunday, at 11 a.m. We will soon be asking for donations of candy and plastic eggs to use for the hunt. We do have a little candy stored from Trunk or Treat to use that is in Riemer's cool basement. Also, we will be hosting an **EGG STUFFING DAY** on Wednesday, March 25 at 9:30 a.m. One of our board members will soon be applying for Thrivent Money to help finance this event + there is \$147 in cash from freewill offerings at various dinners that can be used to help pay.




